

Boxer KO or RSC:

- The ringside doctor must:
 - Where feasible, conduct an examination in accordance with Form B
 - Record the KO/RSC in the boxers blue book
 - Complete Form A
- Copies of Form A & Form B given to the MA, Supervisor and the boxer

The Boxer then sits out a minimum period of time in accordance with Regulations 7.17-7.20

A boxer returning to boxing or sparring after a KO or RSC must:

- Be examined by a GP (after the expiration of the sit out period) and provide that GP with:
 - A blank Form B
 - A copy of Form B completed by the Ringside Doctor
 - A blank Form C
 - Their blue book
- Get from the GP:
 - A completed copy of Form B
 - A completed copy of Form C
 - 'Fit to box' recorded, including name and signature, in their Blue Book below recorded KO/RSC
- Give their MA:
 - Copy of Form A completed by the Ringside Doctor (MA should already have this)
 - Copy of Form B completed by the Ringside Doctor (MA should already have this)
 - Copy of Form B completed by the GP
 - Copy of Form C completed by the GP
 - A copy of Form D
 - Copy of their Blue Book pages:
 - Photo page
 - Page with the KO/RSC recorded
 - Page with 'Fit to box' recorded

The MA then:

- Checks all documents to ensure they are compliant
- Completes the MA section of Form D
- Send copies of all documents to the BAL CEO

The BAL CEO then:

- Circulates documents to the Anti-Doping and Medical Committee
- Anti-Doping and Medical Committee make a determination
- Anti-Doping and Medical Committee advise BAL CEO who advises the MA

The boxer is then cleared to return to boxing and sparring
